- 9:00 Noon Navigating through the PFAS Landscape: Litigation Strategies and Complex Insurance Coverage Issues for the "Forever Chemical" 3.0 HRS Per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) or "forever chemicals" are widely used, long lasting chemicals that break down very slowly over time and pose potential human health and environmental risks. This CLE course will provide counsel with an overview of the litigation landscape involving PFAS, to include recent developments in the law. Moreover, determining liability coverage for long-term disease caused by PFAs is complicated by the question of whether the bodily injury "occurred" during the relevant policy period. Although the Virginia Supreme Court has never addressed this issue, most courts have adopted one of four trigger theories. This session aims to provide an overview of these four generally accepted trigger theories and the likelihood of their use in lawsuits based on PFAs.


